

Submit a Name for Inclusion on the National Work Zone Memorial

The National Work Zone Memorial is a living tribute to the people lost in work zones. With more than 1,600 names to date, it honors work zone workers, motorists, pedestrians, law enforcement officers, public safety officials (i.e., firefighters and paramedics) and children.



• Complete a National Work Zone Memorial Name Submission Form for each person to be considered for inclusion. Anyone may submit the form but a family member must consent before a name is added to the Memorial.

• Forms are due by Dec. 1 to be considered for inclusion the next calendar year.

Step 2 Supporting Documentation

Documentation is needed to verify each incident. The following items are acceptable:

- Official police incident report
- Notarized employer affidavit
- News article about the incident



Step 3 Review and Approval Process

• Completed submission forms are reviewed to confirm the incident meets the criteria* for the person's inclusion on the National Work Zone Memorial.

• Approved names are added to the National Work Zone Memorial each year and unveiled during an In Memoriam ceremony during ATSSA's Annual Convention & Traffic Expo.

* National Work Zone Memorial Criteria

Work zone workers, motorists (drivers and passengers), pedestrians, law enforcement officers and public safety officials (i.e., firefighters and paramedics) who are killed in a work zone are eligible for inclusion on the National Work Zone Memorial.
