




National Work Zone Memorial

Honoring lives lost in work zones

Thousands of men and women have died in work zones, including workers, motorists, pedestrians and first responders.

The National Work Zone Memorial pays homage to the memory of those killed in work zones by displaying their names on a tribute to honor them on a continuous basis. This exhibition travels to sites across the country to help raise public awareness of the hazards that exist in America's roadway work zones.



Host

Display the Memorial at your event

The traditional traveling Memorial and the virtual representation are available for hosting to anyone interested in increasing work zone safety awareness. The tribute has been hosted at media events, schools, DOT lobbies, conferences, welcome centers, construction project launching ceremonies and more. A hosting fee covers shipping and maintenance costs of the physical Memorial. The virtual video is available at no cost.

Names

Submit a name for inclusion

More than 1,600 names of those lost in work zones are inscribed on the Memorial. Honor the memory of someone you know who was lost in a work zone incident by submitting their name for inclusion.

Youth Programs



ATSS Foundation partnered with WorkZoneSafe.com to develop and promote a teen driver learning program. The online course is 100% free and includes national work zone-specific information, thanks to ATSSA support and a grant from PPG. The 50-minute course gives drivers ages 15-19 the opportunity to learn about work zone safety. Students who complete the course are entered into a monthly drawing for a \$500 education scholarship, sponsored by ATSS Foundation.

Scholarships



Roadway Worker Memorial

This scholarship provides financial assistance to help the dependents (children and spouses) of fallen or permanently disabled work zone workers reach their post-high school education goals.

Scholarships are competitive and have a value of up to \$10,000. Applicants who demonstrate a strong commitment to volunteerism may be eligible for an additional \$1,000 Chuck Bailey Memorial Scholarship, in honor of Chuck Bailey, an esteemed member of the roadway safety industry and a tireless volunteer who lost his life in 2002.

This scholarship promotes education and ATSSA involvement while honoring Marty Weed, a longstanding member of ATSSA and an icon in the roadway safety industry. It provides financial assistance for newer engineers specializing or with a strong interest in work zone safety and temporary traffic control to attend ATSSA's Annual Convention & Traffic Expo. This participation provides the opportunity to strengthen their discipline skills and network with hundreds of national and international leaders.

Eligible applicants must meet ALL of the following criteria:

- Be employed by a public agency as an Engineer or P.E. at time of application submission,
- AND have a MAXIMUM of seven years' work experience (work history may be reviewed to address unique situations),
- AND specialize or have a strong interest in work zone safety and temporary traffic control.
