Roadway Worker Memorial

This scholarship provides financial assistance to help the dependents (children and spouses) of fallen or permanently disabled work zone workers reach their post-high school education goals.

Scholarships are competitive and have a value of up to \$10,000. Applicants who demonstrate a strong commitment to volunteerism may be eligible for an additional \$1,000 Chuck Bailey Memorial Scholarship, in honor of Chuck Bailey, an esteemed member of the roadway safety industry and a tireless volunteer who lost his life in 2002. The Foundation has awarded over \$660,000 in scholarships since the program's inception.
